

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Patient Triage Update

We launched our new online consultation tool 'AccuRx Patient Triage' on the 14th of August. Thanks to everyone for their feedback, which has been largely very positive from our patients — we continue to develop and adapt to deliver a sustainable service for our patients and hardworking staff. We are delighted that many patients are finding it easier to access our service, who had previously been unable to navigate the 8am phone rush. We recognise that no solution fits all, and as a reminder, if you are unable to access the online system you can simply phone our reception team as before who will complete the form on your behalf.

Thanks to the information you provide when completing the online form, we have been able to answer many patient's queries directly and promptly, without the need to wait for an appointment – and in general, those that have needed an appointment have been able to book more flexibly with shorter waiting times than previously. As always, such changes take time to embed and we will continue to review our process and look for improvements for both our patients and staff.

Flu Vaccinations 2023-2024

We will be running joint Covid and flu vaccination clinics from 30th September, initially for patients who are eligible for both vaccines.

Invites will be sent in the next couple of weeks to all eligible patients. This will be by text invite where we hold a mobile number and we will phone those patients where we do not hold a mobile number.

Primary Care Network (PCN) Updates

We continue to work with 4 other surgeries in Chippenham and Corsham as part of our Primary Care Network (PCN). There are several PCN teams that are already very successfully providing additional services to our patients. These include the First Contact Practitioner physiotherapy service, as a reminder patients can be booked directly usually on the same day for a consultation about musculoskeletal problems. The Living Well Team work in the community providing support where there are social issues arising from health problems. The PCN pharmacy team are working alongside practices in several areas including medication reviews, blood pressure monitoring and updating medications following hospital attendance.

The Urgent Care Centre (UCC) service is another PCN project. This is situated in the New Road site in Chippenham and provides additional capacity for same day consultations that are accessed by all 5 surgeries in the PCN. Within this team there are doctors, a nurse practitioner, physician associates and paramedics. GPs from the 5 surgeries also work at the Urgent Care Centre on a rota basis. So far this project has been running on a trial basis on Mondays and Fridays with potential to expand this service throughout the week in the future.

The PCN employs several Physicians Associates. They work both in the GP surgeries and at the Urgent Care Centre. Physician Associates are medically trained, generalist healthcare professionals, who work alongside doctors and provide medical care as part of the multidisciplinary team.



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Shingles Vaccination

Who can have the shingles vaccination?

You are eligible for the shingles vaccine if you are aged 70 to 79. The vaccine is not available on the NHS to anyone aged 80 or over.

From 1st September 2023, more people will be eligible for the vaccine. As well as people aged 70 to 79, you'll be eligible:

- When you turn 65 (if you turned 65 before 1st September 2023, you'll be eligible for the vaccine when you turn 70)
- If you are aged 50 or over and have a severely weakened immune system

Will I be contacted when I am eligible?

Yes—Box Surgery will contact you via text to inform you that you are eligible for the vaccine and please contact the surgery to arrange an appointment. However, if you have not yet received a text but you are aware you are at the eligible age please contact the surgery to arrange an appointment.

What is shingles?

Shingles, also known as herpes zoster, is a painful skin rash caused by the reactivation of the chickenpox virus (varicella-zoster virus) in people who have previously had chickenpox.

It begins with a burning sensation in the skin, followed by a rash of very painful fluid-filled blisters that can burst and turn into sore before healing. Often an area just one side of the body is affected, usually the chest but sometimes the head, face and eye.

Pneumococcal Vaccination

Who can have the pneumococcal vaccination?

Babies—1st dose at 12 weeks and a booster dose at 1 year

People aged 65 and over—1 dose when you are 65

Children and adults at higher risk of getting ill—at least 1 dose (some people may need extra doses or regular doses)

Will I be contacted when I am eligible?

Yes—Box Surgery will contact you via text to inform you that you are eligible for the vaccine and please contact the surgery to arrange an appointment.

What is the pneumococcal vaccine for?

The pneumococcal vaccine helps protect against some types of bacterial infections that can cause serious illness like:

- Meningitis
- Sepsis
- Pneumonia


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World Menopause Day- 18th October 2023
